

TULARE COUNTY MUSEUM BOARD MEETING

April 21, 2022 – 2:00 p.m.

The Museum Board members met on April 21, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Present were Kevin Caskey, Amy King, Darla Wegener, Joanne Ledbetter, Lee Terkelsen and Kyle Taylor. No one was absent.

Welcome: Kevin welcomed everyone to the meeting and started the meeting at 2:00 p.m.

Approval of the Minutes: Lee made a motion and Kyle seconded to approve the minutes from the March 17, 2022 meeting.

 - AG Commissioner/Sealer – Mobile Livestock Scale (photos). Kevin made a motion to decline the item, Lee seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

⇒**Maintenance and exhibit update:**

- Bob and Stan have painted the harness shop and made a sign for it. They also painted the side of the museum near the masonic doors and repaired the restroom doors.
- Will help move items in the Record Building so there is space for them to construct a gate so people can walk in and look around but not touch the items in there. Darla suggested that there be a volunteer recognition to the Board of Supervisors with volunteers from the library and the museum.
- Looking at Blacksmith Shop as next project, possible sea train for storage?

- Caminos exhibit is planned to be installed in late May/early June and will have programming each month. Waiting to hear on some grants through Arte Americas.
- Broken window in upstairs of AG museum, The Glass Shop has been out and waiting to replace.
- Waiting on new toilet for Pioneer Village from facilities.
- New lighting installed in cultural gallery in AG museum.
- Will have gutters installed on the AG Museum to help with moss on sidewalks.
- Will have a new roll up door installed in the Middle Room gallery and a threshold on the roll up door going from the curation room to the parking lot in the AG museum.
- Amy is looking into getting a quote to paint the black fence.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

⇒**Budget:** Amy reviewed the distributed budget with the board and indicated that the spending is on track aside from the Facilities charges. Utilities were also over, but Amy confirmed that there were bills from 2021 that were just coming through and being paid now. Amy asked for any questions and there were none.

⇒**New Building Project:** The bid was awarded to Atkins Bergreen and Amy has spoken with Ed Bergreen. He said they will submit their paperwork, which Kyle said goes to the Board of Supervisors on May 3 for approval. They should be able to complete the building in four weeks once they have the steel, but that is three weeks out now and could take some time to get.

⇒**Agents of Discovery:** Museum App (Joel Krupa, Chief Admin. Officer) will join us at the May meeting to give you a more detailed overview of the program.

NEW BUSINESS:

⇒ The board agreed to change May meeting to May 12 since Amy and Darla will be at a workshop.

⇒ Amy brought up the idea of the Museum Board Meetings being every other month (Jan. Mar. May July Sept. Nov.) The board was in favor of the idea and so it will be an action item for the May meeting.

⇒ The Tulare County Museum Jamboree was a huge success! We had a great turnout and people enjoyed their visit to the museum. There was a lot of press coverage in the newspaper and on the radio.

⇒ Jessika started with the museum on March 18 and has been very helpful already.

CURATOR REPORT:

⇒ Amy was a presenter for the mini conference in Fresno for the California Association of Museums.

⇒ Amy spoke at the Downtown Rotary meeting at the Marriott on Wednesday. There was not a lot of support for any volunteer work, but they did suggest applying for the grant through the foundation, which Amy will do.
